



**Under Construction:**

November 2006

**Arvada West High School:** Designed to accommodate 2000 students, the 162,000 square foot facility will replace the original school built in 1963. The new building will have an auxiliary and main gymnasium with locker rooms, auditorium, music rooms, administration, cafeteria/commons, kitchen and core classrooms for Math, English, Special Education, Business, Arts and Wood Technology. The athletic fields, band practice field and tennis courts will be relocated within the site.

*Approximate budget:* \$27.7 million  
*Construction Completed:* Fall 2008

*Construction began:* August 2006  
*Percentage Completed:* 10%

**Bear Creek K-8 School:** Designed to accommodate 1,080 students, the school will be housed in a two-story, 120,000 square foot 21st Century facility. The facility will have a central organizational spine oriented south to north with academic areas to the west, and activities, after school programs and public areas to the east. All classrooms will face north and south to maximize day lighting opportunities.

*Approximate budget:* \$19.8 million  
*Construction Completed:* May 2007

*Construction began:* January 2006  
*Percentage completed:* 61%

**Chatfield Senior High School:** Designed to accommodate 2,100 students, the 270,575 square foot project includes an auxiliary gym, larger Commons, new classroom wing, upgrades to the science wing, music and vocational programs and administrative offices. Specific upgrades include expanding the existing parking lot, tennis courts and temporary classroom buildings. The soccer field, tennis courts and a new athletic practice field will be relocated at a site north of the school.

*Approximate budget:* \$26 million  
*Construction Completed:* May 2008

*Construction began:* June 2006  
*Percentage Completed:* 38%

**Fairmount Elementary School:** Designed to accommodate 450 students, Fairmount Elementary School will receive three new additions including 11 new classrooms, expansion of the kitchen, relocation of the gymnasium and music room, and a rerouted bus loop. The project includes conversion of the existing gymnasium to a cafeteria, remodeling the music room and converting it to a classroom, remodeling the existing kindergarten room for expansion of the administrative space, and upgrading the fire sprinkler system. The district changed general contractors in November 2006.

*Approximate budget:* \$5.3 million  
*Construction Completed:* March 2007

*Construction began:* March 2006  
*Percentage Completed:* 59%

**Golden High School:** The new 188,554 square foot facility, which replaces the original school, is designed to accommodate up to 1,450 students. The two-story classroom wing (which includes daylighting techniques) is built in an "L" shape that encloses two sides of the new courtyard; the third side is flanked by the public areas of the building (Cafeteria, Auditorium and Gym). The LMC is in the heart of the academic building, and can be used for after hour's public events. Site amenities include a new baseball field and softball field and on-site parking for 500. Because of site space restrictions, the soccer field and tennis courts are being developed at the Johnson Facility site.

*Approximate budget:* \$33 million  
*Construction Completed:* July 2008

*Construction began:* October 2006  
*Percentage Completed:* 2%

On November 3, 2004, Jefferson County voters approved ballot issues 3A and 3B, Jeffco Public Schools' \$38.5 million mill levy override and \$323.8 million bond initiatives respectively. The passage of the two measures is helping the district to improve student achievement and to renovate, remodel or rebuild older facilities to bring them up to 21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools of Learning. Of the 356 school projects planned as part of the Capital Improvement Program, 204 have been completed, are being closed out, are currently under construction or are in the bid or design phases. The Bond program is on schedule and on budget.



**Hackberry Hill Elementary School:** Designed to accommodate 480 students in 20 classrooms, the major addition to Hackberry Hill Elementary School includes replacing an existing 25,000 square foot wing (built in 1966) and upgrading the remaining 21,000 square foot facility. The school will receive major electrical system improvements, a partial mechanical system, replacement and miscellaneous building renovation and utility upgrades. The overall general site will be upgraded, including improvements to the paved parking lot.

*Approximate budget:* \$6.2 million

*Construction began:* March 2006

*Construction Completed:* July 2007

*Percentage Completed:* 47%

**Lakewood High School:** Designed to accommodate 1,750 students, the addition and remodel includes 170,000 square feet of new construction and 42,000 square feet of remodeling. The project entails demolition of the existing academic and administration areas and the redevelopment of the site. The new facility will have 44 general classrooms, 12 science classrooms, a library, media area, auxiliary gym, administration area, kitchen and commons. The remodeling includes locker rooms and art department. The 28.5 acre site will include soccer, softball and multi-use fields and reconfigured traffic and parking areas.

*Approximate budget:* \$29.5 million

*Construction began:* December 2005

*Construction Completed:* September 2007

*Percentage Completed:* 58%

**Ralston Valley High School:** Designed to accommodate 1,750 students the expansion areas in the current construction phase include a 47,700 square foot instructional addition (class and science rooms) to the east and 45,700 square feet of class and science room additions to the south. A third 10,443 square foot west addition includes an auxiliary gym with a bleacher mezzanine, weight room and expanded athletic locker rooms.

*Approximate budget:* \$10.5 million

*Construction began:* February 2006

*Construction Completed:* April 2007

*Percentage Completed:* 94%

\* Auxiliary gym and south classrooms open August 2006; east instructional wing opens Spring 2007
