Information	Strategic Plan Overview DUIP Presented by Dr. Carol Eaton DAC members will review the fall 2022 academic baseline data for Jeffco Schools and then discuss and provide feedback for the DAC District Unified Improvement Plan (DUIP) subcommittee. 20 minute presentation: Ensuring high quality materials, all students reading at grade level by 3rd grade. ensuring that every 9th grader is on track with 6 credits or more. Wanting to make sure our students have all of the opportunities. Having extraordinary student experience. including, social workers, psychologists and social/emotional learning. Reading assessments, the trend of the past 4 years, there has been some return to baseline pre-pandemic, MAP assessments: not much difference in math and reading for the past 4 years. Middle schools math was down, but in high school, there have been changes in the math. In reading overall reading is 49%. for 3rd grade There is a literacy gap in children of color, as well as gender with females showing higher reading levels. Jeffco 12th graders as of September 2022: 78% met Reading, Writing, & Communicating 68% met Mathematics 66% met both areas Many 12th grade students are actively engaged in completing demonstrations such as District Capstones that will not be reflected in progress until results are completed and recorded. This is particularly important for English Language learners. The DAC broke into small groups and discussed the DUIP and made recommendations via the DUIP feedback form
